Steph's Dream Wedding Dress

Stephanie has found her dream wedding dress - it's just that she can't see it.

Since she was a little girl, Stephanie has dreamed of being a bride in a stunning dress. But she didn't know her dream would turn out this way. Steph will marry her fiancé, Rob, later this year. Sadly Steph has no idea what Rob really looks like, but she knows he's the one for her.

Thirty-one year-old Stephanie first noticed her vision problems at age 19. That's when she was diagnosed with Cone-Rod Dystrophy — a rare retinal disease that leads to blindness. Slowly but surely, the condition stripped Steph of her independence and confidence. First, it was her driver's licence which was taken away when she was just 23.

"That came as such a shock," Stephanie said. "When I lost my licence, I decided I would travel the world as much as I could while I still had around 70% of my vision."

Over the last few years, Steph's vision has fallen away rapidly — she now has only 3%. "My mum and two of my three brothers have the same genetic condition," she said. "One brother has a Guide Dog and he really encouraged me to give it a go. "I wasn't too sure about it ... but I went along for a half-day trial with a dog named Leo. I didn't like it at first because I couldn't feel the ground with my cane. But then Leo and I got into step.

"I started crying and thinking 'Oh my God, I can get my independence back'. "My fiancé Rob said he'd never seen me walk so fast and freely until that day. It gave me so much confidence!"

Stephanie immediately applied for a Guide Dog and was matched with Rocky last year. "Rocky and I clicked immediately," she said. "Rocky has changed my whole outlook on life. He's been great not only for my independence, but for my mental health too. His companionship is incredible."

With her wedding to Rob coming up, Steph has tackled the daunting task of dress shopping. While Steph and her mum felt the fabric and shape of each dress she tried on, an 'amazing shop assistant' described all the details. "I thought, 'How can I choose a dress I can't see?' — it was pretty scary." Then when Steph tried on the last dress she could feel herself 'lighting up' and she 'just knew that was the one.'

We know that Steph will make a beautiful bride. And with Rob and Rocky by her side, she is feeling very positive about the future.

Jean had a few passions close to her heart: dogs, the ballet, opera, Gilbert and Sullivan, radiography and photography.

Throughout most of her life, Jean would visit the local Brookville dog park in her spare time and bring treats for all the dogs.

Born in 1921, Jean was actively involved with Guide Dogs Victoria for more than 34 years! Jean in her later years cared for her mum who suffered from Macular Degeneration and Jean herself suffered the loss of her vision through Glaucoma. It was through her love of dogs and desire to help people with low vision that she became an avid supporter of Guide Dogs Victoria.

Jean's passions were evident at her funeral service where a congregation of dogs from her beloved dog park were there at her request. Jean's legacy will allow Guide Dogs Victoria to build a Doggy Day Care Centre which is part of our 'Future is in Sight' campaign.

The Doggy Day Care will provide a critical income stream for Guide Dogs Victoria and, just as importantly, care for and enrich the lives of thousands of dogs. Jean's friend, Anthea, said, "Jean would be smiling sitting up on her cloud in heaven knowing this is how her legacy would benefit dogs,"
