### Case Study Meet Janet...

In June 1984 Janet was involved in a head on collision in a motor vehicle accident. She sustained traumatic injuries to the frontal and temporal lobes of her brain. Her injuries resulted in a loss of vision (bilateral lower field loss), short term memory, as well as an array of other significant cognitive and physical impairments.

Janet coped for over thirty years by tilting her head to the ground to look out for hazards. She had developed serious neck and back problems, increased anxiety and a lack of confidence. After many trips and falls, Janet was referred to our ABI Mobility service by a private physiotherapist where she was assessed and then trained in the use of the long cane. She now uses her long cane at all times when getting around outdoors and her confidence has improved dramatically as has her independence.

Janet's training involved an assessment over a couple of weeks to ascertain her current level of mobility and functional vision. A program was then designed collaboratively with her to determine her goals and the best possible training measures and outcomes. This program was spanned over twelve weeks with a review at the end. Janet still has ongoing follow ups with the ABI team to refresh her cane skills and address any new mobility goals. She also enjoys participating in group programs and other events when they arise.





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
