Guide Dogs Victoria


Since 1957, Guide Dogs Victoria has been providing vital support to Victorians who have low vision or blindness.

Since our founding days, our services have grown far beyond just Guide Dogs to include a wide range of community initiatives, and training and education programs.

Today we work to ensure people with low vision or blindness are active and involved members of the community. We do this by teaching practical skills to help children and adults reach their personal potential: regardless of when or how they became affected by low vision or blindness. These skills are developed under our Orientation & Mobility training programs and with the support of Occupational Therapists.

The number of Victorians who need our services is growing every year, and vision loss will significantly increase over the next decade due to conditions of ageing and diabetes.

At Guide Dogs Victoria, it is essential that we plan for the future and ensure our sustainability, so that we can continue to support Victorians for many years to come.



Guide Dogs

The partnership between a Guide Dog and their handler is a bond of trust like no other. In fact, a saying that we use in Guide Dog training is "Before Guidance Comes Trust".

A Guide Dog can create profound change for a person with low vision or blindness by offering a perfect blend of independence and companionship. Think about your daily activities like going to the shops, visiting a friend, or dropping your kids to school. Now imagine trying to do these things if you were blind.

A Guide Dog can open a new world of opportunity and independence for a person with vision loss. What's more, they offer companionship and confidence through the relationship they form with the person they are matched with.

Everyone experiences the world differently. Whether we're conscious of them or not, we all learn skills to help us navigate our daily environments


Getting on a train, going to work or school, or functioning at home — each one requires a set of practical abilities.

Our Dogs

Our Guide Dogs undertake comprehensive, world-class training by our respected Dog Training team.

This includes comprehensive safety and relationship training, and detailed behavioral analysis from an early age. We think it's important to learn each dog's skills and temperament to gain an intimate understanding of how they might eventually match with our clients.

Every Guide Dog goes through an intensive training program to learn the skills required to navigate communities – from busy city streets, to the uneven paths and tracks of rural environments. After training, dogs are matched with their handler through a detailed selection process that caters for individual personality, mobility needs, and lifestyle.

The average working relationship of a Guide Dog and a person with low vision is between eight and ten years. As a result, it is absolutely essential that a handler and a Guide Dog share a powerful bond, built on trust, companionship and a strong connection.

HOW TO

Leaving a gift to Guide Dogs Victoria is a simple process

Through leaving a gift in your Will, you can make a profound change to the life of a person who is blind or has low vision.

You may never meet the person whose life your kindness changes, but they will never forget you.

All gifts are greatly valued and significantly help in our future planning.

Having a valid Will is the only way you can ensure that your wishes will be met as a Will needs to be regularly updated and reviewed to reflect your current circumstances.

When creating your Will, firstly provide for your family and friends, and then consider leaving a lasting legacy to Guide Dogs Victoria. A gift can take many forms:

Residuary

The remainder of your estate after specific gifts have been disbursed

Percentage

A percentage of either residue or the entire estate

Pecuniary

A specific gift of cash

A Specific Asset

Real estate, shares or other particular items of value

Leave a gift in your Will

Consult your legal advisor to ensure the option you have chosen best reflects your intentions.

Discuss your decision with your family and loved ones. This will ensure they understand and support your reasons for choosing to help Guide Dogs Victoria in such a special way.

Otus Fellowship members receive a Certificate of Appreciation, a special membership pin, are invited to exclusive Guide Dog events, and are kept up to date with what is happening at Guide Dogs Victoria.

The Otus Fellowship was named to honour one of our champion stud dogs, Otus, a living legend at Guide Dogs Victoria. His first litter produced six Guide Dogs and one Pets as Therapy dog. Otus officially retired from the program in 2004 at 10 and a half years. He was honoured in November 2004 when he received a medallion from the Board of Directors. He is still fondly remembered by a large number of Guide Dogs Victoria supporters.

LEAVING A GIFT IN YOUR WILL

Frequently Asked Questions

Who needs to make a Will?

Everyone over the age of 18. Without a Will your assets may not reach your loved ones and the causes you care about.

How do I make or change my Will?

We would strongly advise the use of a solicitor to obtain expert advice, to ensure accuracy and that the option you have chosen best reflects your intentions. We also advise that you consult a solicitor when writing or making changes to an existing Will to ensure your Will is accurate and best reflects your intentions.

You need to choose an Executor who will be responsible for making sure your wishes are carried out. This person can be a legal professional, trusted family member or friend.

Where do I find a solicitor?

If you do not have a solicitor, you can consult the Law Institute of Victoria to find a solicitor in your area who specialises in Wills and Estates.

What are the main types of gifts in Wills?

- Residual legacy: A residual legacy is a portion of your estate, or the balance remaining after loved ones and expenses are provided for. The remainder or a portion of the estate is donated after other gifts, expenses and debts are settled.
- Specific amount of money: This type of gift is sometimes called a 'pecuniary legacy'. This allows you to nominate a specific or fixed amount of money.
- Specific items of value: Anything of value such as property, shares, jewellery or works of art, may be specifically named in your Will as a gift.



LEAVING A GIFT IN YOUR WILL FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

What type of gift would Guide Dogs Victoria prefer?

Whilst any gift is greatly appreciated, a residual legacy is the best option because it maintains a relative value and automatically adjusts to changes in the value of your estate. This is the legacy type we ask our supporters to consider because it should not decrease in value over time.

Why should I leave a gift in my Will to a Guide Dogs Victoria?

By including Guide Dogs Victoria in your Will, you are helping us to provide vital services to Victorians who are blind or have low vision the breeding, raising and training of Guide Dogs is a significant part of this activity.

You may never meet the person whose life your kindness has changed, but they will never forget you.

Why should I let you know that I have left you a gift in my Will?

Informing us of your generous decision is important as it allows us to thank you personally and to welcome you into our Otus Fellowship; a group of likeminded supporters of Guide Dogs Victoria's work. As an Otus Fellowship member you will receive invitations to our exclusive events and be kept informed of new developments at Guide Dogs Victoria.

What about if I want my gift to remain anonymous?

We would still love to thank you privately, however, we respect all our donor's wishes and your details will be held in strictest confidence. You will control the level of contact that you receive from us.
